State of North Carolina Wake County: SS

On this 15 day of May 1843 Personally appeared before the Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions for Wake County in the County of Wake, Hartwell Reves [sic] the son of Frederick and Bedy Reves a resident of said County aged 61 years, who, being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision of the act of Congress passed July 4, 1836. That his Mother was the widow of Frederick Reves deceased, who was a soldier in the Revolution in the company of Captain Roads [sic, Joseph Thomas Rhodes] of the 10th Regiment North Carolina Continental line and that his Mother was on the pension when she died from the State of North Carolina.

He further declares that his mother Betty Reves was married to his father as he has been informed on the __ day of therefore 1776. That his Father the aforesaid Frederick Reves died on the __day of before 1800, and that his Mother remained a widow to her death which happened on the 26 or 27 day of May 1837, as will more fully appear by reference to the proof hereunto annexed.

This day personally appeared before me Jordan Womble a Justice of the Peace for the County aforesaid, Hartwell Reves a resident of Wake County and made oath in due form of law, that he is the 4 child of Frederick and Betty Reves and that he was born as he has always understood and believes on the 1st day of March 1783, and that the small bit of paper Numbered 10 by the Magistrate and hereto attached is and has been hailed by him as the Family Record for many Years, and that there were 3 children older than himself.
