[There is no application in the file. The following is the only substantive document.]

Dear Sir [Nathan Sanford in Senate]/ I must beg leave to trespass on you in requesting your aid in behalf of an aged Lady in this City – Charlotte Hazen the widow of General Hazen of the Revolutionary war was allowed a pension of two hundred dollars a year and received it semi annually for several years past. She is now informed that it will be necessary for her to obtain a Certificate from the Secretary at War to enable her to have this sum paid to her at the office at New York where she has heretofore received it. permit me Sir to Intreat the favour of you to obtain this paper on her behalf and forward it by my friend John W Taylor who will deliver it to me. I am with Great Respect/
Albany 1 April 1820 Your Most Obedient Servant/ John Taylor

NOTE: Fold3 has this file under the state of New York, but Hazen's Regiment was not actually attached to any state. Hazen was from Canada, and his regiment comprised many French-speaking Canadians.
