On this 28th day of August one thousand Eight hundred and forty three personally appeared before me the subscriber one of the Justices of the Court of Common pleas held at Chambersburg for Franklin County state of Pennsylvania, Mary Casey a resident of Greencastle Franklin County Penna'a aged 86 years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed July 4<sup>th</sup> 1836 and the act Explanatory of said act passed March 3<sup>d</sup> 1837. that she was married to Joseph Allsop, who resided in Frederick County Maryland, and who served in the revolutionary war one tour in the flying camp. that he enlisted as a private in Captain Morris's Company of the 7<sup>th</sup> Maryland Regiment for the term of nine months on the 8th day of June 1778 and was discharged on the 30th day of March 1779. that he was in service two tours afterwards the last was at the Surrender of Cornwallis, at York [19 Oct 1781], and served about one year By Reference as to his service to the proof herewith transmited will more fully appear.

She further declares that she was married to Joseph Allsop on the tenth day of January in the year Seventeen hundred and seventy Eight that her husband the aforesaid Joseph Allsop died on the [blank] day of [blank] in the year seventeen hundred and Eighty three that she was afterward married to Peter Casey, who died on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of December in the year seventeen hundred and Ninety four. that she was a widow on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July 1836 and still remains a widow as will more fully appear by reference to the proof hereto annexed.

I hereby Certify, that it appears by the Muster Rolls of the Revolution, remaining in this Office, That Joseph Allsop, enlisted as a private, in Captain Morris's Company, of the Maryland Regiment, for the term of nine months, on the [illegible] day of June, 1778, and was discharged on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of [Ma]rch, 1779, and paid.
