## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

CUMBERLAND COUNTY, Inferior Court of Common Pleas, of the Term of June 1820

On this twenty second day of June 1820, personally appeared in open court, being a court of record for the said county, Isaac Atkinson, labourer aged eighty eight years, resident at Maurice River in said county, who, being first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath, declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows: that he elisted in the Spring of 1777 in the Company of Capt. Rolling Madison of the 12<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment for the term of three years, that he served in said Regiment for the full term for which he enlisted, and by a reenlistment afterwards until the end of the war, when he was honorably discharged, that he was in the Battles of Brandywine [11 Sep 1777], Germantown [4 Oct 1777], monmouth [28 Jun 1778] (in which last he was wounded) that his declaration to obtain a pension he believes was made the 21st day of April 1818, and his certificate is dated 26 of November 1818. No. 4584 And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain person engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed.

NOTE: On 16 Aug 1853 Anna Atkinson of East Creek in Cape May County NJ, 65, applied for a pension stating that as Anna Alloways she married Isaac Atkinson in 1819, that they lived together most recently in Port Elizabeth in Cumberland County NJ, and that he died on 23 Sep 1838. On an application for bounty land dated 22 May 1855 her age is given as "about seventy" and the place of marriage as Gloucester County.
