[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

State of North Carolina Person County

On this the twentieth day of June A.D. 1839 personally appeared before me a Justice of the Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions for the County and State aforesaid Elizabeth Moore of said County aged Seventy-eight years, who being duly sworn according to law, doth, on her oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the Act of Congress passed June 7th, 1838 entitled "an act granting half pay and pensions to certain widows:"

That she is the widow of the late Robert Moore who served at least six months as a private soldier in the company of Captain Alfred Moore as will appear by his discharge reaccompanying this declaration bearing date the 13th day of March 1776 – that afterwards (to wit) on the 12th day of June A.D. 1778, he was appointed Captain of a Company of Foot raised in the County of Caswell, North Carolina, as will appear by his Commission annexed, that he had the command of a Company under Lieutenant Colonel Archibald Lytle as his superior officer from the above date till the 1st of December 1778 as appears by the accompanying payroll; that he always understood he acted as Captain in the service of the United States from that time till the close of the War, and from all the evidence, documentary, traditionary and of living witnesses, she expresses a confident belief that he served in the war in the capacity of Captain for a space of time not less than two years. That at the time he entered the service he was a resident of the County of Caswell & State of North Carolina, and that he entered the service as a volunteer – She has no knowledge of the battles in which he was engaged or of the country through which he marched, though she recollects distinctly hearing her husband often speak of marching through South Carolina and having been stationed some time, she thinks, in Savannah.

She further declares that she was married to the said Captain Robert Moore on the 24th day of August in the year 1784, that of their marriage the following named children were born (viz.)

Robert Moore was born the 4th day of August 1775 Joseph Moore was born this 27th day of September 1787 Alexander Moore was born the 5th day of December 1789 Sarah I. Moore was born the 30th day of May 1792 Elizabeth Moore was born the 6th day of January 1795

as will appear by the family register hereto annexed on which the two first named were by a former wife, she further declares that her husband, the aforesaid Robert Moore died on the 13th day of February A.D. 1816; that she was not married to him prior to his leaving the service, but the marriage took place previous to the 1st of January 1794, viz. at the time above stated.



Personally appeared before the undersigned an acting Justice of the peace in and for the County aforesaid John Dolley²⁴ a resident of the aforesaid County aged eighty-five years who being first qualified maketh oath that during the war of the revolution he was acquainted with the late Captain Robert Moore of Person County and State aforesaid. This deponent states upon oath that in the fall of the year 1780 that there was a draft of five months militia men to serve in said war of revolution and that in the town of Hillsboro on the 4th of October 1780 there was a rendezvous of troops in Said town of Hillsboro when this deponent states upon his oath that he their saw the aforesaid Captain Robert Moore in command of a company of Militia from the County of Caswell under General John Butler as his Superior Officer. The said troops was marched from said rendezvous to the town of Salisbury North Carolina, and from thence to Camden South Carolina and that during this march I frequently saw the aforesaid Captain Robert Moore in command of his Company of Militia men. This deponent further states that he the said John Dolley was ordered from Camden South Carolina to the Cheraw Hills, South Carolina in the aforesaid Captain Robert Moore then in Command of his Company of Militia Men, was ordered to some other point not distinctly recollected. This deponent further states that he always understood that the said Captain Robert Moore served out all of the tour in the Service of the United States. And further this deponent saith not. This 1st day of May 1839.

State of North Carolina Caswell County

Personally appeared before me an acting Justice of the Peace for the County of Caswell Benjamin Long²⁵ a resident of Said County aged eighty years who being duly qualified maketh oath that he was intimately acquainted with Captain Robert Moore deceased late of Person County North Carolina that they were raised in the same neighborhood and were intimate associates in their early youth. This deponent states upon oath that he was acquainted with Robert Moore while acting as a private Soldier in the Army of the United States in defense of American liberty and that he served his country faithfully in that Capacity. This deponent further states upon his said oath that sometime during the year 1778 the aforesaid Robert Moore was commissioned by Governor Caswell [Richard Caswell], as Captain to take charge of a company of men, and that he served not less than two years in defense of the United States in the capacity of Captain. This deponent further maketh oath that the said Captain Robert Moore was married in May 1780 to a Miss Mary Drury, and that he was present at the marriage, that he lived near them and was on terms of intimacy with the family, that of the marriage 2 children were born whose names were John D Moore and Susannah Moore, and that his said Wife Mary died some time during the year 1783 leaving him Surviving, that afterwards (to wit) sometime in August 1784 the said Captain Robert Moore was married to a Miss Elizabeth McGehee who was personally known to this deponent and that he was present at this his second marriage, that of this marriage several children were born most of whom are known to him that he is acquaintance and intimacy with the said Captain Robert Moore continued up to his death which occurred sometime in the year 1816 leading his wife Elizabeth him Surviving; That he has known Mrs. Elizabeth Moore since the death of her husband, that she has never since married, but is still his widow and this deponent with great Confidence saith that Mrs. Elizabeth Moore who is now making application for a pension, for Services rendered by her husband during the American Revolution is the widow of the aforesaid Captain Robert Moore – and further he sayeth not. Personally appeared before the undersigned an acting Justice of the peace in and for the County aforesaid John Long²⁶ a resident of the aforesaid County aged eighty years who being first qualified maketh oath that during the war of the Revolution he was acquainted with the late Captain Robert Moore of Person County and State aforesaid. This deponent states upon oath that in the fall of the year 1780 that he was drafted for three months to serve in said war of Revolution and that he was marched from the County of Caswell and State aforesaid to the town of Salisbury and State of North Carolina. This deponent further states that upon his oath that in

the town of Salisbury he saw Captain Robert Moore in Command of a Company of Militia men from the County of Caswell under General John Butler as his Superior Officer. The said troops were marched from the aforesaid town of Salisbury to the South, and this deponent states that he himself continued to march as far as Catawba River and that he frequently saw the aforesaid Captain Robert Moore in command of his Company of Militia men. This deponent states that he was discharged in the month of February 1781 leaving the aforesaid Captain Robert Moore in the Service of the United States and in command of his company of Soldiers in defense of American liberty. He further states that he lived in the same neighborhood with Captain Robert Moore and that he was well acquainted with and was knowing to his Services as an officer before and after his three months tour in the fall and winter of 1780 and 1781. This deponent further states upon his oath that the aforesaid Captain Robert Moore he believes to have been in the Battle of Guilford [March 15, 1781] and that during the revolution he served not less than 2 years as an officer. And further this deponent saith not.
