Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." State of Pennsylvania Washington County: SS

On this seventh day of November in the year 1838 personally appeared before the undersigned an associate Judge of the County Common Pleas in and for the County aforesaid Martha Rankin a resident of North Strabane Township Washington County, Pennsylvania aged sixty-seven years, who after being first duly sworn according to law doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by an act of Congress passed July 7th 1838 entitled "An act granting half pay and pensions to certain widows." That she is the widow of James Rankin who was a private soldier in the Virginia line of the Army of the Revolution.

She further declares that she was married to the said James Rankin on the 10th day of January in the year 1792; that her husband the aforesaid James Rankin died on the 29th day of December 1812; that she was not married to him previous to his leaving the service, but the marriage took place prior to the 1st day of January 1794; & that she has remained his widow ever since his death.

She further declares that she is enabled to fix with accuracy the periods of her marriage and her husband's death by a reference to the family record, which is herewith transmitted to the Pension Office. That as evidence of her husband's service in the Army of the Revolution, she has now in her possession a patent from the United States for one hundred acres of land granted as a bounty to her husband which said Patton is now on record in the Land Office and is described as follows, Survey No. 4906 of one hundred acres of land in a Military Warrant No. 3694 on the North fork of the White Oak Creek between the waters of the little Miami and Scioto – & bearing date February 10th A.D. 1831 –

Sworn to and subscribed on the day and year 1st above mentioned before S/ Thos. McKeever S/ Martha Rankin

[Veteran's widow was pensioned at the rate of \$80 per annum commencing March 4th, 1836, for her husband's service for 2 years in the Virginia service.]
