[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

State of North Carolina Rockingham County: Court of Pleas & Quarter Sessions

On this 28<sup>th</sup> day of November in the year 1832 personally appeared before the Justices of the County Court of Rockingham Elijah Lynch resident of the County of Rockingham State of North Carolina aged sixty-seven years being duly sworn according to law on his oath makes the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision of an act of Congress passed the seventh of June 1832.

That he enlisted in the Army of the United States in the year 1778 with Captain James Curtly and served in the \_\_ Regiment of the Guards in the line and served under the following officers for the first year in the company of Captain James Curtly¹ at the end of which time \_\_ Porter [perhaps Captain Thomas Porter] was appointed Captain of the same company in which he continued during the [indecipherable word]² term of his service – Colonel Francis Taylor, Major John Roberts were the officers of the Regiment at the time of Elisting [sic, enlisting?] he resided in the County of Culpeper & State of Virginia and enlisted at the Court House of said County and marched to the Barracks in Albemarle County Virginia where he remained as one of the Guard of the prisoners of that Station until for [sic sic] three years at the end of which time he marched to Winchester Virginia where he remained four months when he was regularly discharged in the year 1781 after having served three years & four months & that his discharge was given him by Captain Porter which he was unfortunate as to have destroyed by fire.

[p 16: On November 27, 1844 in Rockingham County North Carolina, Aaron Lynch, 47, made a claim on the half of himself and other heirs at law of Rose Lynch, widow of Elijah Lynch, a revolutionary war pensioner at the rate of \$80 per annum; that Elijah Lynch died December 20,

I could find no other likely candidate for the officer identified by this veteran as "James Curtly."

1839 leaving Rose Lynch his widow; she died June 18, 1844 leaving the following children surviving her: Aaron Lynch, Elijah Lynch, Robert Lynch, Ann who intermarried with Alexander Grogan, and Sarah who intermarried with John Willson, all of legal age; that it is his understanding that Elijah & Rose Lynch were married in 1785 as supported by a marriage bond.

[p 12: Copy of a marriage bond dated October fifth, 1785 issued in Culpeper County Virginia to Elijah Lynch & James Rosson conditioned upon the marriage of Elijah Lynch to Rosa Crawford of the County of Culpeper.]

[Veteran was pensioned at the rate of \$80 per annum commencing March 4<sup>th</sup>, 1831, for service as a private for two years in the Virginia service. His widow was pensioned in a like amount.]
