The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

District of Virginia, SS

On this 27th day of August 1818 before us the subscribers Justices of the County Court of Amelia personally appeared Cy. Hundley aged sixty-two years resident in Mecklenburg County in the said district who being by us first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provisions made by the late act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war." That he said Cy Hundley enlisted in the County of Amelia in the State of Virginia in the company commanded by Captain John Markham of the first Regiment in the troops of Virginia on Continental establishment, that he continued to serve in the said Corps or in the service of the United States until the 7th day of September 1776 when he was discharged from service in Williamsburg in the state of Virginia. And that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support, and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.

I William Worsham¹ of the County of Prince Edward in the State aforesaid do hereby certify that Cy Hundley and myself enlisted in the Continental Army under Captain John Marcham in brackets sic] in the month of September 1775 and that we served together in the said company down about Norfolk for about Twelve months, the said company was attached to the 1st Regiment which was commanded by Colonel Patrick Henry. Given under my hand this 28th day of October 1819

[p 10: On July 8, 1840 in Mecklenburg County Virginia, Ann Hundley, 73, filed for a widow's pension under the 1838 act stating that she is the widow of Josiah Hundley late of said County, who was a private in the militia and Continental service of Virginia in the revolutionary war; that he entered into the service before their marriage consequently she does not recollect any of the

battles he was in or the officers under whom he served but she recalls that he frequently spoke of the battles in which he was engaged; that she married him July 28, 1791; that her husband died August 11, 1827; and she remains his widow.

Virginia: Charlotte County to wit:

I Seth Farley do hereby certify that I was intimately acquainted with Josiah Hundley, deceased, in the War of the Revolution, and recollect that in the year 1775, he enlisted as well as my memory now serves, under Captain Marcham [sic], in the Virginia Continental line, for the term of one year – which term he served faithfully – I further certify, that he has been dead for many years leaving a Widow, who is still alive, according to the latest account I have of her – the said Hundley served a tour of three months, in North Carolina in 1781 under Captain Walker, for I was with him. He was also at Camden in 1780, under Captain Walker for three months, but I was not with him – I am in the eighty first year of my age, and served in the revolution.
