Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

Honorable S. O. Bland House of Representatives

My dear Mr. Bland:

In response to your letter of the 3rd instant, I have the honor to advise you that the Revolutionary War records of this Bureau fail to afford any information in regard to a David MEDERMAN.

There is a typographical error in the citation, "David Mederman of Spotsylvania County, Virginia, pensioned 1835, pension 215", which is quoted by H. J. Ekenrode's book of Revolutionary soldiers, for the name of the soldier should be written David McDorman instead David Mederman.

Said David McDorman served as a private in the Virginia Line for the war of the Revolution and while a resident of Spotsylvania County, Virginia, he was allowed pension on certificate #951, dated October 14, 1829, rate of \$80 per annum, commenced January 29, 1829, Richmond, Virginia Agency, under the Act of May 15, 1828.

The claims under said act were adjudicated in the Treasury Department and there are no papers on file in this Bureau relative to David McDorman.
