Before me Benjamin Watkins a Justice of the peace for the County of Pittsylvania, in the State of Virginia personally appeared today [4 Sep 1835], Thomas Marshall in the County & State aforesaid who exhibited to me certificate issued by the Secretary of the Treasury, numbered 786 and dated the 3rd day of August 1829 setting forth that he is entitled to pay, under the above mentioned Act, as a surviving Sergeant of dragoons in the Virginia Line of the Army of the Revolution, at the rate of Fifteen dollars a month, and the said Thomas Marshall then and there made Oath that he is the person named in the said certificate, and in testimony thereof, signed his name to this affidavit. and that I know Thomas Marshall to be this person whoom he represents himself to be.
